Three errors and a couple of stolen bases with hits by Collin Clyne and Erich Prokosch scored a pair. Two walks, stolen base and wild pitch set up a score in the third on a ground out and opened the flood gates in the fourth. Then New Ulm had three stolen bases, a walk and a hit batsman plus singles by Clyne, Tim Kehren , Connor Stark and Dylan Schreckenber for the scores. Rosemount's first run came in the fourth when Trevor Kolden went deep to centerfield and raced around to score on a throwing area from the cut-off. One more came in the sixth on three straight hits: singles by Mathew Wells, Zachary Zabo and a double by Morris Valenzuela. Clyne and designated hitter Prokosch had a pair of hits. Prokosch got on base four straight times and scored twice; also doubling in the sixth. Wells had a double and single for Rosemount.
