Chris Peters

Nominated by Andrew Peters

In his 16th year with the New Ulm Brewers as a catcher and pitcher. He also managed the Brewers for four years from 2001-04. The Brewers went to State three

of those years as they compiled a 95-32 record during that period. Chris is third all-time amongst New Ulm amateur players in at bats, hits and doubles. He also has over 40 wins in close to 600 innings pitched with 500 strikeouts. His lifetime batting average is over .300 with 51 homeruns. At St. James in 2000 Chris had a 5-hit game including 3 homeruns. Chris played baseball at New Ulm High School and for New Ulm Legion.



Ted Marti

The President and CEO of August Schell Brewery since 1985. Ted has continued a long tradition of support for New Ulm's amateur baseball teams. The New Ulm Brewers began play in 1939. Schell's has
